This weight adjusts for both probability of selection and survey non-response. No post-stratification weighting adjustment was performed. When applied in analyses, this weight serves to produce estimated population totals. Note that if producing estimated population totals using specific survey questions, this weight does not adjust for item non-response for any specific question. For more accurate population total estimates, item non-response adjustments should be performed. As an example, suppose the specific question of interest had 5% (.05) missing values due to survey non-response. Then nwweight can be adjusted for this item non-response by simply creating a new weight defined as (nwweight / 0.95).
